Post-Op Desexing Handout

Thank you for choosing Avonhead Vets to complete a desexing procedure on your beloved cat – we can assure you, we have taken every precaution to ensure they have received the best care and treatment, while they have been with us today 😊.

WHAT TO DO, WHEN YOU GET HOME

Your cat may have an anaesthesia “hangover.” They may be grumpy, or very reactive to noise, quick motions, bright lights, etc. Keep them in a quiet, dark, warm place. Keep them separated from other pets and children, and general commotion. You may need to reintroduce food slowly. Offer a small amount of food and water, if they are not nauseous. We advise looking at your pet’s incision daily, so that you know what it looks like, that way you will be able to see how it is improving.

DIETARY CHANGE AFTER SURGERY

We are working together with the team at Royal Canin, to help provide the specific dietary requirements for cats, after they have been neutered. In this pack, there is a voucher for your first bag.
